Sticky Knowledge

timeline - a line to show the order of important events in the past.

present - events that are happening now.

past - events that have already happened.

beyond living memory - over 100 years ago.

source - something that gives us information about the past.

evidence - the information historians take from sources.

compare - the similarities and differences between something.

old - having been around for a relatively long time.

memory - something remembered from the past.

new - having recently come into existence.

school - a place where children go to be educated/learn
