
Nursery Newsletter Summer 1



<u>HT5 Topic</u>

This half term our topic is **'Buckle Up'**. We will initially be focusing on all things 'Transport', using the books 'The Train Ride' and 'Jake's First Day ' and a number of non-fiction books too. The children will be learning facts, retelling stories, getting involved in lots of 'Transport' and 'Pirate' crafts. We will also be learning about the signs of Spring and the farm coming to visit bringing animals for the children to touch and learn about.

This half term the children will be given a sheet of activities in their book bag which you will be able to cross off (one a week). The activities will be very practical hands on activities, ranging from maths, topic and crafts. These are to be completed at home and you will be able to send evidence on Dojo if you wish.

We would love it if you could continue to support children at home by promoting independence in getting themselves dressed and going to the toilet; writing letters in their name; counting for fun, forwards and backwards; speaking in full sentences and modelling sentences to them to copy back to you.
