Rosh Hashanah is a celebration of the start of the Jewish New Year and is a time to reflect.

Yom Kippur is known as the 'Day of Atonement' and is a time to ask God's forgiveness for any sins.

Sukkot commemorates God's protection during the period after the Exodus.

Shavuot commemorates the revelation of the Torah.

Purim commemorates the time when Jewish people were saved from death and the bravery of Esther.

Celebrating festivals helps create a sense of a global Jewish community for Jewish people.
