

Competition Code of Conduct for Competitors

- Always respect opponents, teammates and officials.
- Act with dignity and within the rules at all times.
- Accept success and failure in a selfless and positive way
- Be responsible for caring for your own and others' equipment, clothing and property.
- Always wear appropriate sporting clothing, footwear and personal protective equipment such as shin guards as stated in the competition rules. Jewellery must not be worn during an event.
- Speak out immediately to your school staff member if you are concerned or uncomfortable in anyway at a sporting event.



<u>Competition Code of Conduct</u> for Staff in Charge of Teams / Players

- Teams must always have a lead teacher / coach / adult as designated by the Head Teacher. Schools should have their own risk assessments and first aid protocols in place and follow appropriate adult : child ratios.
- Before the event, the lead adult should familiarise themselves with the event rules, format and procedures / risk assessment and then pass on this information to all their pupils, colleagues and spectators.
- School staff are responsible for ensuring their pupils, colleagues and spectators follow the competition rules and always display the highest standards of sporting conduct.
- School staff should work with event staff and immediately report any concerns so concerns can be addressed.



Competition Code of Conduct for Spectators.

- Encourage athletes to learn the rules and competition procedures and always to participate within them.
- Never challenge or argue with officials.
- Spectators to view from the designated area and follow the health and safety and photographic procedures as outlined in the event introduction.
- Help athletes to recognise good performance, not just results and to show respect to teammates, opponents and officials at all times.
- Set a good example by recognising good sportsmanship and applauding the good performances of all.
